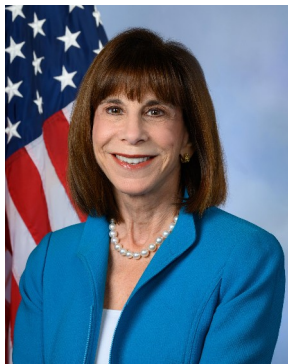

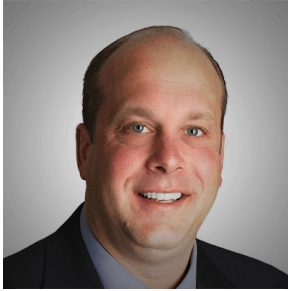
Brandon Gray – District 62

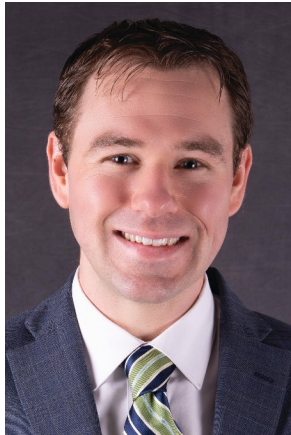
